10. the effectiveness and participation rates of the parents as teachers program established under AS 14.03.420, including measures of efficiency and effectiveness that demonstrate the effects of the program on school readiness.

Progress of the department toward implementing the school accountability provisions of AS 14.03.123, and in assisting high schools to become accredited.

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

In May 2018, the U.S. Department of Education approved Alaska's ESSA State Plan for the equitable education for all students. Alaska's education Accountability Support Index (ASI) is based on the belief that every student should have the opportunity to receive an excellent education every day. Toward that end, data are collected in six categories to indicate a school's success. The following nine subgroups have been identified at the federal and state level for inclusion in ASI:

- African American
- Alaska Native/American Indian
- Asian/Pacific Islander
- Caucasian
- Hispanic
- Two or More Races
- Students with Disabilities
- English Learners
- Economically Disadvantaged

Addendum to the ESEA Consolidated State Plan

The U.S. Department of Education requires states to develop and implement a statewide accountability system in support of all public elementary and secondary school students in meeting the state academic standards. However, because the DEED adopted new cut scores through the standard setting process for the assessment results the accountability designations were delayed. Cut scores are the thresholds between performance designations such as proficient and advanced. Alaska identified schools for Targeted, and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement using data from the 2022-2023 school year in the spring of 2024 to ensure school identification resumes as quickly as possible. The 2023-2024 school designations were completed on schedule in October 2024.

The revised assessment regulations, which are used in the accountability system, that reflect the proposed cut scores were submitted to the State Board of Education and Early Development (SBOE) at the December 6, 2023, meeting. The 30-day public comment period opened following the December SBOE meeting. The new cut scores were approved during the second review at the SBOE meeting on January 17, 2024. Accountability 2022-2023 calculations were completed, and results were posted, in May 2024. The 2023-2024 accountability calculations were completed on time. The U.S. Department of Education was informed and advised DEED to submit an addendum to the ESSA State Plan which reflects the changes to the accountability system.

As part of the addendum terms, DEED afforded a reasonable opportunity for public comment. DEED presented the proposed changes in the addendum in webinar. These changes are outlined below. This opportunity was announced in DEED's widely distributed ESEA newsletter and was sent by direct email to superintendents and other interested parties.

Due to the extenuating circumstances in previous years (e.g., missing data from 2020, poor participation in 2021, adoption of a new assessment in 2022) and the changes in the cut scores in 2023, meeting the minimum N of ten in calculating achievement measures was problematic for some schools across grade levels and indicators. Further, because there are many small schools in Alaska, a way to maximize the number of schools that reach the minimum N of ten was needed. DEED decided to collapse grade spans to achieve this. Collapsing grade spans meant that whether schools met the minimum N of ten on the indicator was based on the number of students in all grades combined. When collapsing grade spans was modeled with 2019 data, an additional

approximately 28 schools were able to get a minimum N of ten for a given indicator (without needing to aggregate three years of data). Further, DEED is revising its long-term goals and measurements of interim progress by shifting the timeline forward by two years for the indicators Academic Achievement, Graduation Rate, and English Learner Progress.

Achievement

DEED measures the percentage of students scoring at the proficient or advanced achievement levels on the Alaska System of Academic Readiness (AK STAR) in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics. While the indicator is measured and reported for all students and all subgroups, for the purpose of inclusion in the overall index, schools earn between zero and 100 points for all students group, with ELA and mathematics being weighted equally.

Growth

Because DEED adopted new cut scores for the 2023-2024 assessments, the Growth indicator was not calculated for the 2022-2023 accountability system. DEED substituted grade three ELA in place of the Growth indicator for the 2022-2023 accountability index calculations. Growth was reintroduced in the 2023-2024 accountability system.

In recognition of the importance of academic growth in the success of schools, there is a growth calculation for a school's Accountability Support Index (ASI). The Growth indicator for each school's ASI is calculated by dividing the number of eligible students meeting their growth targets by the number of students eligible to be counted. Schools earn between zero and 100 points equal to the percentage of students meeting their growth targets in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics.

Graduation Rate

Graduation is the culmination of over 12 years of academic and 21st century skills and is a measure of the success of a K-12 education system. High school graduation has far reaching economic impacts for the graduate, taxpayers, and society. Graduation rates are measured and reported for all students and all subgroups. For the purpose of inclusion in the index, the prior year graduation rate is used. Schools earn between zero and 100 points equal to the four- and five-year rate.

In order to maintain continuity for each indicator, it was decided not to aggregate up to three years of data to reach a minimum N of ten for the Graduation Rate indicator for the 2023-2024 accountability year. This means that only one year of data was used to calculate this indicator.

English Learner Progress

All districts have a process by which they identify students that qualify for support as an English Learner (EL). All students who have qualified for those supports take the English language proficiency assessment, ACCESS for English Learners, that measures proficiency in four domains: listening, reading, speaking, and writing. In Alaska, a student is considered proficient in the English language when he/she achieves an overall composite proficiency level (CPL) of 4.5. Recognizing that growth in language acquisition and proficiency is not linear; each student's annual determination of overall CPL is based on the student's most recent overall CPL and the number of expected years remaining to reach an overall CPL of 4.5.

Annual Meaningful Differentiation

Due to the change in cut scores, DEED used the adjusted accountability system for the 2022-2023 calculations. DEED returned to using the accountability system in 2023-2024. The 2022-2023 and the 2023-2024 weighting of each indicator is described in the tables below.

Identification of Schools

Due to the change in cut scores, DEED has revised the timeline for the identification of schools. The designations were calculated in Spring 2024. There were no changes to the methodology.

Continued Support for School and LEA Improvement

DEED did not revise its exit criteria for schools identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), as well as Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI).

Reporting and Designations

System for School Success

The System for School Success is Alaska’s accountability system for public schools. The 2023-2024 school year was the fourth time the System for School Success was used to help schools and districts measure their performance on key indicators, identify areas for improvement, and target resources and support for all students to receive an excellent education and be prepared for college or a career after high school. There are five types of school designations: Comprehensive Support and Improvement: Lowest 5 percent (CSI 5%), Comprehensive Support and Improvement: Graduation Rate (CSI GR) Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI), Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI), and Universal Support. The primary purpose of these school designations is to provide information for families, tribes, communities, educators, and policy makers to plan and support an equitable education for each student in Alaska’s public school system. Accreditation

The decision to seek accreditation is a local school board option. Since the 1970s, the SBOE has delegated accreditation to the Northwest Accreditation Commission. As of 2012, the Commission is now an accrediting division of Cognia (formerly AdvancED), a non-profit organization that also provides standards, protocols, and support for accrediting schools in all 50 states including the District of Columbia and 90 countries.

Accreditation continues to be a two-step process: first, a comprehensive Internal Review (Self-Assessment) utilizing Cognia’s research-based school/system performance standards, and second, an independent External Review (Engagement Review) conducted every six years by Cognia professional Lead and Associate Lead Evaluators.

As of October 2024, of Alaska's 493 public schools, 278 are currently accredited through the voluntary process. These include schools that were accredited as a result of the systems accreditation process. This process allows for all schools within an accredited district to then be accredited by engaging in the district system's approved plan for accreditation. As of October 2024, nine districts have been accredited at the systems level.

The largest category of accredited schools were elementary schools, followed closely by High Schools. Regional Educational Attendance Areas (REAs), where most K-12 schools are located, often accredit a greater percentage of their schools than single-city, borough, or municipal districts. City, borough, and municipal school districts typically accredit their high schools, although this is changing as all schools in a district become accredited as a system rather than school-by-school. Twenty-nine of Alaska's public school districts, plus Mt. Edgecumbe High School, have at least one accredited school.

Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

Title I – Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged (CFDA 84.010A)

Title I, Part A Grants – Basic

Funds provided through a formula to districts to serve high poverty schools to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments. Funding is 91.40 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part A Administration

Funds for state administration are placed into consolidated administration. Up to 1 percent of the state allocation may be used unless capped by law. Funding is .08 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part A School Improvement sec 1003(a)

Funds set-aside (up to four percent as allowed) from Title I-A state allocation to provide school improvement (SI) grants under section 1003(a) to schools designated as Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) Lowest 5%, CSI Graduation Rate, or Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) or Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) using the state accountability system. 95 percent of the funding set-aside is determined through a formula and awarded to districts that have eligible schools. Funding is 6.65 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part A School Improvement sec 1003(a) State Activities

Five percent of the funds set-aside for school improvement is kept by the state for activities for the School Recognition and Support team to support schools designated CSI or TSI. Funding is 0.034 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part D, Subpart 2

Funds provided through the Title I, Part A state allocation are awarded through a competitive grant process to districts to support programs for neglected, delinquent and at-risk youth. Funding is 0.079 percent of the total grant award. (Percentage varies by year through Title I formula).

Title I, Part C – Education of Migratory Children (CFDA 84.011A)

Title I, Part C Migrant Education Grants

Funding to identify and address the unique educational needs of migratory children and youth. Funding is allocated by the state to participating districts through a formula based on the number and needs of migratory children. Funding is 94.09 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part C Migrant Education Administration

Funds for state administration placed into consolidated administration. Up to one percent of state allocation can be retained unless capped by law. Funding is 0.74 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part C Migrant Education State Activities

The state determines the percentage of the funding needed to operate state activities unique to the Migrant Education Program, including identification and recruitment of migratory children and youth. The remainder is allocated to districts in grants. Funding is 5.23 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part D, Subpart 1 – Neglected & Delinquent
(CFDA 84.013A)

Title I, Part D, Subpart 1 – Neglected & Delinquent Grants

Funds provided through formula grants to districts serving students in the youth and adult correctional facilities so that those youth have the opportunity to meet the same academic standards as all students. Funding is 99.26 percent of the total grant award.

Title I, Part D, Subpart 1 – Neglected & Delinquent Administration

Funds for state administration placed into consolidated administration. Up to one percent of state allocation may be used unless capped by law. Funding is 0.74 percent of the total grant award.

Title II, Part A – Supporting Effective Instruction
(CFDA 84.367A, CFDA 84.367B)

Title II, Part A Supporting Effective Instruction Formula Grants

Funds provided through formula grants to districts for the purpose of improving student achievement through strategies such as improving teacher and principal quality and increasing the number of effective teachers in the classroom and principals in schools. Funding is 92.15 percent of the total grant award.

Title II, Part A Supporting Effective Instruction State Administration

Funds for state administration of II-A formula grants placed into consolidated administration. Funding is one percent of the total grant award.

Title II, Part A State Activities

Funds for state activities to provide professional development and support to districts to improve the skills of teachers. Funding is four percent of the total grant award.

Title II, Part A Principal Support

Funds for state activities to provide professional development and support to districts to improve the skills of principals and other school leaders. Funding is 2.85 percent of the total grant award.

Title III, Part A – Language Instruction for English Learners and Immigrant Students
(CFDA 84.365A)

Title III, Part A English Language Acquisition formula grants

Funds provided through formula grants to districts to help ensure that children who are English learners, including immigrant children and youth, attain English proficiency and meet the same academic standards as all children are expected to meet. Districts must have a sufficient number of English learners to receive a minimum grant award of \$10,000. Funding is 87.34 percent of the total grant award.

Title III, Part A Immigrant Grants

States must also set-aside a state-determined amount of up to 15 percent of the state allocation to offer competitive grants to districts that have experienced a significant increase in the number or percent of immigrant children and youth. Funding is 1.23 percent of the total grant award.

Title III, Part A Administration

Funds for state administration of the formula and immigrant grant programs are placed into consolidated administration. (State may reserve the greatest of 5 percent of the state allocation, or up to \$175,000 for state activities and administration. Of the amount reserved, 50 percent may be used for administration.) Funding is 7.18 percent of the total grant award.

Title III, Part A State Activities

Funds set-aside for state activities to provide professional development activities support to district staff in language instruction strategies and programs for English learners, and other authorized uses. Funding is 4.25 percent of the total grant award.

Title IV, Part A – Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants

(CFDA 84.424A)

Title IV, Part A Administration

States can retain up to five percent of the total award, using one percent for program administration and up to four percent for state level activities. Alaska is electing to retain the full five percent. One percent of this, is reserved for the administration costs associated with managing the program. The other four percent is reserved for state level activities. Sec. 4104(a)(1)(2). Funding is five percent of the total grant award.

Title IV-A Formula Grants

Districts are eligible for Title IV-A formula funds if they received Title I, Part A funding the preceding year. Districts that did not receive Title I, Part A funding are ineligible per Sec. 4105(1). All remaining districts by using: “an amount that bears the same relationship to the total amount of such reservation as the amount the local education agency (LEA) received under subpart 2 of Part A of Title I for the preceding year bears to the total amount received by all LEAs in the State under such subpart for the preceding fiscal year.” Sec. 4105(a)(1). Districts must receive an award of at least \$10,000 per Sec. 4105(a)(1). Funding is 95 percent of the total grant award.

Bipartisan Safer Communities Act Stronger Connections Grant Program

(CFDA 84.424A)

(This is one-time funding that expires September 2026)

Bipartisan Safer Communities Act – Stronger Connections Grant – Competitive Grants

Congress provided funding in the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA) for the Stronger Connections grant program under Title IV, Part A of the ESEA, but established some requirements unique from the typical Title IV, Part A program. The state awarded nine subgrants to districts (one district awardee included a consortium including two other districts) through a competitive process for a three-year grant period beginning in state FY2023. Funding was awarded to high-need districts to establish safer and healthier learning environments and to prevent and respond to acts of bullying, violence, and hate that impact our school communities at individual and systemic levels, among other programs and activities. These grants were awarded to districts with 35 percent or more of their students at or below the poverty line and meeting one other criteria of need. Funding is 95 percent of the total grant award.

Bipartisan Safer Communities Act – Stronger Connections Grant – State Activities

States may reserve up to 1 percent of its allocation for State administration of the program and may use any remaining reserved funds for State-level activities to support safe and healthy students under section 4108 of the ESEA, including providing technical assistance and other supports to districts implementing Stronger Connections subgrants. Funding is five percent of the total grant award.

Title IV, Part B – 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC)

(CFDA 84.287C)

Title IV, Part B 21st CCLC Competitive Grants

Provides competitive grants to districts and non-profit entities for after-school and summer programs that increase student academic achievement by providing academic assistance and educational enrichment opportunities to students attending high-poverty and low-performing schools. Funding is 95 percent of the total grant award.

Title IV, Part B 21st CCLC Administration

Funds for state administration, including costs associated with running funding competition, placed into consolidated administration. Funding is 2 percent of the total grant award.

Title IV, Part B 21st CCLC State Activities

Funding is utilized to provide state grantees training, technical assistance, mentoring, and professional development in best practices to improve their capacity to provide quality afterschool programming. Funding is also used for monitoring and evaluation of program effectiveness. Funding is three percent of the total grant award.

Title VI Part A – State Assessments

(CFDA 84.369A)

Funds provided to pay the costs of the development of the State assessments and standards required by Title I Part A. 100 percent goes towards state assessments/standards.

Title VII-B – McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth

(CFDA 84.196A)

McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth Grants

Funding awarded to states to make competitive grant awards to districts with the largest number of homeless children and youth to ensure that each has equal access to the same free, appropriate public education as other children and youths. Funding is 75.10 percent of the total grant award.

McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth State Activities

Funds to administer the McKinney-Vento grant program and to provide technical assistance and professional development to districts to increase their capacity to identify and provide services to homeless children and youth. Funding is 24.90 percent of the total grant award.

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

IDEA Part 611 Title VI-B

(CFDA 84.027A)

Title VI, Part B LEA Grants

Federal Funding for local education agency (LEA) Title VI, Part B activities. Districts are required to provide services for the identification and support of students with disabilities under IDEA. Staff, programs, equipment, supplies, and contracts are funded through this funding. Funding is 90.6 percent of the total grant award.

Title VI, Part B Monitoring / Compliance

Federal funding for the state administration of monitoring / compliance activities for state Title VI, Part B programs. In accordance with federal requirements, local education agencies (LEAs) are monitored for compliance with regulations with corrective action requirements. Federal reporting is involved in this activity as well as training and technical assistance to LEAs. This funding goes to personnel costs, travel, equipment, supplies, and contracts related to the compliance monitoring activities. Funding is 0.2 percent of the total grant award.

Title VI, Part B Administration

Federal funding for the state administration of Title VI, Part B programs. State special education staff provide technical assistance and support to the local education agencies (LEAs), monitor for compliance, and maintain procedural safeguard requirements, federal reporting and other support activities. This funding goes to personnel costs, travel, equipment, supplies, and contracts. Administrative funding is 2.1 percent of the total grant award.

Title VI, Part B Discretionary

Federal funding for discretionary Title VI, Part B programs. This funding goes to special education related and supporting programs identified as critical in need for special education related issues and populations. The funding for these programs involves personnel costs, travel, equipment, supplies, and contracts. Funding is 7.1 percent of the total grant award.

IDEA Part B 619 Preschool Disabled

(CFDA 84.173A)

Preschool Disabled LEA Grants

Federal funding for local education agency (LEA) programs for disabled preschool students. Districts are required to provide services for the identification and support of preschool disabled students under IDEA. Staff, programs, equipment, supplies and contracts are funded through this funding. Funding is 72.4 percent of the total grant award.

Preschool Disabled Administration

Federal funding for the state administration of disabled preschool student programs. State special education staff provide technical assistance and support to the LEAs, monitor for compliance, maintain procedural safeguard requirements, federal reporting and other support activities specific to disabled preschool students and related programs. This funding goes to personnel costs, travel, equipment, supplies, and contracts. Administrative funding is 5.5 percent of the total grant award.

Preschool Disabled Discretionary

Federal funding for discretionary programs related to preschool disabled students. This funding goes to special education related and supporting programs identified as critical in need for disabled preschool population related programs. The funding for these programs involves personnel costs, travel, equipment, supplies, and contracts. Funding is 22.1 percent of the total grant award.

Pathways to Partnerships Disability Innovation Funds Grants

(CFDA 84.421E)

This five-year federal grant funds a program, in collaboration with five partner organizations, to support youth with disabilities in transitioning to employment through innovative and collaborative initiatives. Eighty percent of the grant is allocated to program partners, while the remaining 20 percent is retained by the state to administer program requirements.

Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V)

Carl Perkins Vocational Education

(CFDA 84.048A)

Carl Perkins Vocational Education Secondary Grants (Perkins)

Secondary school districts are eligible for at least 75 percent of the Perkins' state allocation. This funding must be used to strengthen the academic and career and technical skills of career and technical education (CTE) students by improving/expanding/modernizing CTE programs. Grant funding amounts are allocated by a formula determined by census and low-income populations. Funding is 79.9 percent of the total grant award.

Carl Perkins Vocational Education Leadership

Funding is used to develop and improve CTE program support at the state level to meet current industry standards, evaluate funded programs, provide professional development for CTE teachers/academic teachers/guidance professionals/administrators, integrate instruction of academic standards and CTE programs, assess how Perkins-defined special populations are being served, develop/improve/expand the use of program technology, and support Alaska Department of Education and Early Development

alignment among secondary and postsecondary education agencies and other appropriate entities to enable students to achieve technical certificates, credentials and degrees as well as required academic standards. Funding is 10 percent of the total grant award.

Carl Perkins Vocational Education Non-Traditional Occupations

Funding is used to promote and prepare individuals for training and employment in areas with an underrepresented gender of 25 percent or less of the national workforce in that occupation. For example, females are underrepresented in welding, while males are underrepresented in nursing. Funding is 1 percent of the total grant award.

Carl Perkins Vocational Education Corrections

Funding is used to support the success of individuals in state institutions by supporting CTE programs. Funding to Department of Corrections is 0.6 percent of the total grant award.

Carl Perkins Vocational Education Postsecondary Grants

Postsecondary grants are up to 15 percent of the state's allocation for Perkins. This funding is distributed on a competitive basis for three-year development cycles. There are 5 grantees in this current grant cycle which focus on the improvement and expansion of preparing CTE students at post-secondary institutions. Funding is 5.1 percent of the total grant award.

Carl Perkins Vocational Education Administration

Perkins Administration funding is used to develop a State Plan, review local plans, monitor and evaluate program effectiveness, program data collection and accountability, assure compliance with Perkins requirements, and provide technical assistance to grantees. Funding is five percent of the total grant award.

Comprehensive Literacy State Development (CLSD) Grant (CFDA 81.371C)

Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grants to Districts

The initial CLSD Grant is a five-year grant in its fifth year. Funding was awarded through a competitive grant process to educational entities based on need and innovation in literacy. The purpose of the grant is to promote and support literacy from birth to grade 12 in schools and communities. Funding is 95 percent of the total grant award and was awarded to districts.

Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grant Administration

Funding is for the administration of the activities required by the grant. Funding is five percent of the total grant award.

In October of 2024, the department applied for and received a second CLSD grant to continue literacy efforts in the state. The new five-year grant will overlap with the current CLSD grant by one year. New grantees will be determined in the spring of 2025. The funding requirement will remain at 95 percent of the total grant going to districts with five percent of the grant remaining with the state to cover the administration of the required activities.

Trauma Recovery in Schools (AK – TRIS) (CFDA 84-424C)

A five-year (2019-2024) federal grant by the U.S. Department of Education to expand delivering mental health services to students who have experienced trauma and are struggling in school as a result. Work is being done by the Alaska Child Trauma Center and the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District. The FY2025 allocation to districts is a no cost extension. This is the last year of the grant.

Advancing Wellness and Resiliency in Education (Project AWARE)

(CFDA 93.243)

The purpose of Project AWARE (2020-2025) is to develop a sustainable infrastructure for school-based mental health programs and services. It is expected that the recipient will build a collaborative partnership that includes the State Education Agency (SEA), the Local Education Agency (LEA), the State Mental Health Agency (SMHA), community-based providers of behavioral health care services, school personnel, community organizations, families, and school-aged youth.

Institute of Museum and Library Services

(CFDA 45.310)

The purpose of this grant is for libraries and archives to partner with community organization to help meet the needs of children, parents, teenagers, adult learners, senior citizens, and the unemployed. Services can include homework centers, computer instruction, access to e-books and adaptive technology, and development of outreach programs to the underserved.

National Endowment for the Arts – State Partnership Agreement Grants

(CFDA 45.025)

The National Endowment for the Arts' (NEA) State & Regional Partnership Agreement (SRPA) grants are awarded to the nation's 56 state and jurisdictional arts agencies (SAAs), and the six regional arts organizations (RAOs) whose members comprise SAAs. State Partnership Agreement grants include general funding for the execution of all aspects of the SAA's strategic plan and designated funding for folk & traditional arts, arts education, and reaching underserved groups/communities. All SAAs, RAOs, and their national service organization must apply annually for this support. Approximately one third of all organizations submit a full application ("ON-YEAR") while the remaining organizations submit abbreviated applications ("OFF-YEAR"). The Alaska State Council on the Arts is the statutorily designated SAA for the State of Alaska (AS 44.27.058. National endowment funds), and awards subgrants to eligible organizations, agencies and individuals including schools and school districts on a quarterly, biannual or annual basis, according to regulation and program guidelines.

United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Grants

State Administrative Expense Fund

(CFDA 10.560)

USDA funding is for the state administration of the Food and Nutrition Services Programs. This funding level is based on program participation in Alaska. Funding is 100 percent administrative for program service delivery and program execution.

Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)

(CFDA 10.558)

Child and Adult Care Food Program

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) provides funding for meals and administrative costs to sponsors of the CACFPs. Programs must serve meals in accordance with USDA regulations, file monthly claims for reimbursement, and be in compliance with all other USDA CACFP regulations. Funding is 100 percent pass-through.

CACFP Cash-in-Lieu

USDA funding for CACFP program sponsors is for those programs who elect cash instead of receiving USDA commodities. Exact amount varies by year. Programs receive cash-in-lieu for each reimbursable lunch and supper served. Funding is 100 percent pass-through.

CACFP Audit Funds

USDA provides funding for audits, compliance reviews, technical assistance and general oversight to assure program integrity. First priority funding is to reimburse CACFP programs for mandatory audits. Funding is approximately 25 percent pass-through. 75 percent is provided for program service delivery and program execution.

National School Lunch Program (NSLP)

(CFDA 10.555, CFDA 10.556, and CFDA 10.553)

USDA also provides funding for meals to sponsors of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) includes schools and Residential Child Care Institutions (RCCI). This component also includes Special Milk Program, Afterschool Snack, and School Breakfast Program. Agencies must serve meals in accordance with USDA regulations, file monthly claims for reimbursement, and be in compliance with all other USDA NSLP regulations. Funding is 100 percent pass-through.

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)

(CFDA 10.559)

USDA provides funding for meals to sponsors of the National School Lunch Program includes schools and Residential Child Care Institutions. Programs must serve meals in accordance with USDA regulations, file monthly claims for reimbursement, and be in compliance with all other USDA SFSP regulations. Funding is 100 percent pass-through.

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)

(CFDA 10.582)

USDA provides funding is for low-income elementary schools participating in the National School Lunch Program for the purchase of fresh produce for snacks. Agencies must serve snacks in accordance with USDA regulations, file monthly claims for reimbursement, and be in compliance with all other USDA FFVP regulations. Funding is 95 percent pass-through and five percent of the grant is provided to the state for program service delivery and program execution.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)

(CFDA 10.568)

USDA provides credit for commodity purchases for program participants (non-profit food relief agencies) and administrative funds. Funds retained in-house are for personnel costs and travel. The remaining funds are granted to the Food Bank of Alaska for the administration of the TEFAP program, with the largest expense in the transportation of commodity foods. Funding is approximately 90 percent pass-through with 10 percent provided for administrative costs.

USDA Commodity Program

USDA provides credit for commodity purchase for program participants (schools, RCCIs, & childcare agencies); a per-case fee is assessed by the state to the program participants to cover administrative costs.

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act

(This is one-time funding that expired September 2023)

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II)

(CFDA 84.425D)

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund LEA Grants

DEED awarded subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) to address the impact that the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools. Funding is 90 percent of the total grant award.

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund Administration and SEA Reserve

A state education agency (SEA) may retain up to 10 percent of its ESSER Fund grant (the “SEA Reserve”), to address emergency needs as determined by the SEA resulting from COVID-19, which may be funded by subgrants or contracts. From the SEA Reserve, the SEA may also use one-half of one percent of its total grant for administrative costs. Funding is 10 percent of the total grant award.

Governor’s Emergency Relief Fund (GEER II)

(CFDA 84.425R)

Governor’s Emergency Relief Fund Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools (EANS I)

Under the GEER Fund, the Governor was awarded funds to provide services or assistance to eligible non-public schools to address the impact that COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, on non-public school students and teachers in the State.

American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act

(This is one-time funding that expires September 2024)

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III)

(CFDA 84.425U)

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund LEA Grants

DEED awarded subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) to address the impact that the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools. The ARP Act requires an LEA to reserve not less than 20 percent of its ARP ESSER allocation to address the academic impact of lost instructional time through the implementation of evidence-based interventions. Funding is 90 percent of the total grant award.

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund Administration and SEA Reserve

Not less than five percent of the State’s grant must be reserved to carry out, directly or through subgrants or contracts, activities to address the academic impact of lost instructional time by supporting the implementation of evidence-based interventions. Not less than one percent of the State’s grant must be reserved to carry out, directly or through subgrants or contracts, the implementation of evidence-based summer enrichment programs. Not less than one percent of the State’s grant must be reserved to carry out, directly or through subgrants or contracts, the implementation of evidence-based comprehensive after-school programs. In addition, not more than one-half of one percent of the State’s total American Rescue Plan (ARP) Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund award may be reserved for administrative costs. The remainder, if any, of funds not allocated to local education agencies (LEAs) or reserved for mandatory set-asides or administrative costs (up to three percent, depending on the amount otherwise reserved) may be used for emergency needs as determined by the state education agency (SEA) to address issues responding to COVID-19. Funding is 10 percent of the total grant award.

Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY I)

(CFDA 84.425W)

American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief – Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY I) LEA Grants

DEED awarded subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) to address the impact that the Novel Coronavirus Disease Alaska Department of Education and Early Development

2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools. LEAs must use ARP-HCY funds to identify homeless children and youth, to provide homeless children and youth with wrap-around services to address the challenges of COVID-19, and to enable homeless children and youth to attend school and fully participate in school activities. Funding is 76 percent of the total grant award.

American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief – Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY I) SEA Reserve

A state education agency (SEA) may retain 25 percent or less of its ESSER Fund grant (the “SEA Reserve”), to address emergency needs as determined by the SEA resulting from COVID-19, which may be addressed through the use of subgrants or contracts. Funding is 24 percent of the total grant award.

Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY II)

(CFDA 84.425W)

American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief – Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY I) LEA Grants

The Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) awarded subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) to address the impact that the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools. Local education agencies (LEAs) must use American Rescue Plan Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY) funds to identify homeless children and youth, to provide homeless children and youth with wrap-around services to address the challenges of COVID-19, and to enable homeless children and youth to attend school and fully participate in school activities. Funding is 75 percent of the total grant award.

American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief – Homeless Children and Youth (ARP-HCY I) SEA Reserve

A state education agency (SEA) may retain 25 percent or less of its Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund grant (the “SEA Reserve”), to address emergency needs as determined by the state education agency (SEA) resulting from COVID-19, which may be addressed through the use of subgrants or contracts. Funding is 25 percent of the total grant award.

IDEA Title VI-B Special Education

American Rescue Plan IDEA Title VI-B Special Education

One-time funding to districts for Alaska’s FY2022 school year is \$8.6 million. This total was divided under the same formula as the Part 611 Title VI-B funds with zero percent reserve for administration at the state level.

IDEA Part 619 Special Education Preschool

American Rescue Plan IDEA Part 619 Special Education Preschool

One-time funding to districts for the 2022-2023 school year was \$666,666. Funds expired September 30, 2024. This total was divided under the same formula as the Part 619 preschool disabled funds with zero percent reserve for administration at the state level.

State Funding

Alaska State Council on the Arts (General Fund Match)

The Alaska State Council on the Arts is the statutorily designated State Arts Agency (SAA) for the State of Alaska, and awards subgrants to eligible organizations, agencies and individuals including schools and school districts on a quarterly, biannual or annual basis, according to regulation and program guidelines. Most often, these subgrants include matching funds split between

- Federal – National Endowment for the Arts,
- General Fund Match, and
- Other (private foundation, which depends on subgrant regulation and guidelines for fund sources).

Subgrants align to Component Core Services to: provide support to enable Alaskan citizens to participate in the arts; and provide support to enable Alaskan students to receive arts education.

Pre-Kindergarten Grants

Competitive three-year grants that are awarded to districts for building or improving pre-school programs. Pre-elementary schools are primarily designed to prepare children, three to five years of age, for elementary school; regularly serve groups of five or more children; and are operated by a school or a Head Start agency.

Alaska Reads Act Early Learning Program Grants

The Alaska Reads Act established the district-wide Early Education Program (EEP) Grant. The purpose of this grant program is to provide funding for the development or improvement of district-wide early education programs for students four and five years of age. Eligible five-year-old students will turn five after the kindergarten-age cut-off date. To avoid duplication of programs and to facilitate resource sharing, school districts must meet with each local and tribal Head Start program within their school district prior to applying. School districts will be prioritized for funding based on low performance ratings in the System of School Support, DEED’s accountability system.

Youth In Detention

Per AS 14.07.020(a)(5), the DEED must provide year-round funds to public school districts with detention facilities. These funds are distributed to school districts in the form of a grant based on the adjusted average daily membership (ADM) calculated from the bed count of each facility.

Alternative Schools

Funds from the DEED and the Department of Health, Division of Behavioral Health provide grants to alternative schools in Alaska. Alaska’s Alternative Schools are a safety net for the most at-risk students in the communities they serve. They provide specialized education tailored to the individual needs of each student and fully recognize that providing students with safety, meeting their basic needs, and addressing their significant behavioral and mental health needs are prerequisites for learning. This model is highly personalized and accommodating—providing students with flexibility in scheduling and services typically not available in traditional school settings. Students arrive at these alternative schools, for the most part, having already experienced significant school challenges.

Career and Technical Education Programs of Study (CTEPS)

This program provides Career and Technical Education (CTE) grants to school districts to develop or expand CTE programs and work-based learning opportunities for students.

These grants provided additional resources to school district programs that provide students with the opportunity to engage in hands-on learning experiences that connect classroom learning to real-world application in high-demand career fields. Grants were used to develop and enhance CTE Programs of Study (CTEPS), procure equipment or supplies, and provide necessary training to educators. Grant activities were linked to existing or developing CTEPS. Grant recipients were encouraged to partner with local industries, tribal entities, and higher education institutions to develop programs that meet the needs of the local and regional workforce. By aligning their programs with regional needs, CTE programs can help students develop the skills they need to succeed in high-demand careers and contribute to their local economies.

Suicide Prevention

Funding comes to the DEED from the Statewide Suicide Prevention Council (SSPC). Since FY2013, DEED has granted

funds to school districts statewide to implement evidence-based and evidence-informed suicide prevention activities. Ranging from eight to 10 grants per year for approximately \$25,000 per grant, rural and urban school districts compete for funds to implement suicide prevention programs and activities.

Broadband Access Grants

The Alaska School Broadband Assistance Grant (BAG) program was created to assist schools increasing internet download speeds. Originally established in 2014 by the Alaska State Legislature, this grant allowed schools to reach download speeds of 10 Mbps. In 2020, the State Legislature revised the statute to help schools reach 100 Mbps download speeds in 2024.

Residential Grants

School districts with approved residential schools for students grades nine through 12 may be reimbursed a per-pupil monthly stipend to assist with the costs of operating the residential school under AS 14.16.200. To be eligible for reimbursement for costs, a residential school must provide a suitable student dormitory, food service, and daily access to a public school offering the appropriate grade level.

Pupil Transportation

The pupil transportation program is a grant funded program based on using the established district per child cost per AS 14.09.010 multiplied by the district's average daily membership less the correspondence students. The funds are provided for the purpose of pupil transportation to and from the schools within the student's transportation service area in accordance with AS 14.09.010 and regulations 4 AAC 27.006 – 27.990. A transportation program can include (1) district-operated bussing, (2) contractor operated bussing, or (3) fee in-lieu-of transportation agreements.

Quality Schools

The purpose of the Quality Schools grant program is to increase student achievement through the methodical improvement of Alaska's public schools. Districts must dedicate their grant funds to efforts that clearly fall under one of the established grant goal categories: Student Standards, Professional, Family, School Business and Community Networks, and School Excellence Standards. Districts must be able to demonstrate how their funded activities contribute to student academic achievement.

Education Raffle Grant

The education raffle grant is a supplemental grant distributed to school districts based on adjusted average daily membership. Under AS 43.23.230(c), it is funded by an appropriation of 50 percent of the permanent fund dividend education raffle donations received. Grants will also include transfers from the education endowment fund when the fund's average market value for a fiscal year exceeds \$1 million.

Onetime Payment

The sum of \$174.9 million was appropriated from the general fund to the DEED to be distributed as grants to school districts according to the adjusted average daily membership for each district for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 (House Bill 39, Chapter 1, FSSLA 2023).

Base Student Allocation / Foundation Award

The basic appropriation of state monies allocated to each school district based on the foundation formula. The public school foundation funding formula is defined in AS 14.17, State Aid for Public Schools. The current state public school funding formula was adopted under Senate Bill 36 in 1998 and implemented in 1999.

Other Funding

Alaska State Council on the Arts, Rasmuson Foundation

As a public corporation, the Alaska State Council on the Arts (ASCA) is statutorily enabled to accept gifts, contributions, and bequests of unrestricted funds from individuals, foundations, corporations, and other organizations or institutions for the purpose of furthering the strategic objectives of the council's programs (AS 44.27.052(a)(4)). As such, ASCA has applied for and received funds to make subgrants to eligible organizations, agencies and individuals including schools and school districts from the Rasmuson Foundation. These subgrant programs include funding for subrecipients including grants in the Arts in Education fund, the Youth Cultural Heritage fund, Harper Arts Touring fund, Individual Artist support, and the Community Arts Partnership program. According to the guidelines of the applicable grant programs, subgrants may further leverage funds split between

- Federal – National Endowment for the Arts, and
- General Fund Match.

[Alaska State Council on the Arts, Margaret A. Cargill Philanthropies](#)

As part of its statutory responsibilities (AS 44.27.052(a)(4)), the Alaska State Council on the Arts (ASCA) has applied for and received support from the Margaret A. Cargill Philanthropies with the desired impacts: 1) More teachers in Alaska are recruited and retained who are competent and confident to teach in and through the arts and cultures, 2) A sustainable collaboration between institutions of higher education, K-12 school districts and arts nonprofits is built to support teacher development. This partnership is ongoing through FY2026. The model programming is titled “Munartet Project” in Kodiak, and additional subgrants and services impact eligible applicants statewide.

All definitions below are from the [Alaska Uniform Chart of Accounts](#) which school districts are required to use.

[City/Borough Appropriations](#)

Revenues and In-kind services received from cities and boroughs.

[In-Kind Services](#)

In-kind services provided without charge by the local governmental unit (city or borough) in lieu of a cash appropriation or in addition to such an appropriation. Amounts credited to this account are for services that would otherwise be purchased by the school district, valued at fair market value and supported by appropriate documentation, including a billing from the governmental unit (city or borough). The allowable services that may be provided or paid for are utilities, energy, insurance, audit services, and maintenance of plant. A billing for utilities and energy is to include the quantity used and price. A billing for insurance and audits is to include the actual invoices from the provider that clearly shows the district’s portion. Billings for maintenance of facilities are to include time spent by city or borough employees on maintenance of district facilities and the rate for their time.

[Earnings on Investments](#)

Interest or other earnings resulting from investment of school district funds.

[Other Local Revenue](#)

All other local revenues which are not classified in any of the required accounts above. Fees collected from students and adults for use of school district operated swimming pools. Monies collected from the rental of school facilities such as the gymnasium. Unrestricted cash donations to the school district for school purposes made by individuals or organizations. Prior year recovery, out-of-state tuition and transportation, community services, proceeds from sale of supplies, equipment rentals and parking fee receipts. In-kind contributions other than from cities and boroughs, such as tribal organizations.

[Tuition from Students](#)

Tuition payments received from students enrolled in any instructional program for which a tuition fee is collected by the

district.

Tuition from Districts

Tuition payments received from other school districts enrolled in any instructional program for which a tuition fee is collected by the district.

E-Rate

To account for the total E-rate subsidy provided by the Universal Service Program.

Federal Revenue

There are two types of Federal Revenue, Direct and Through the State of Alaska. Direct Federal Revenue is reserved for revenue from direct federal sources. Federal Revenue-Through the State of Alaska is reserved for Federal grant revenue received through the DEED.

Fund Transfers In

Money received unconditionally from another fund without expectation of repayment. Such monies are other financing sources of the receiving fund.

Unreserved Fund Balance

Within the school operating fund, the unreserved portion of the year-end fund balance is the portion of the fund balance remaining after the six deductions listed under 4 AAC 09.160(a) are removed.

Response to AS 14.03.078(4)

Each school district's and each school's progress in aligning curriculum with state education performance standards.

Since 1998, the Quality Schools Initiative has worked to increase student achievement through the methodical improvement of Alaska's public schools. The Quality Schools Initiative promotes this school improvement by providing clear standards for schools to attain. A cornerstone of the Quality Schools Initiative is to support district efforts to align local curricula to the Alaska State Education Performance Standards.

In the 2022-2023 school year a number of districts reported dedicating a portion of their Quality School funding toward realigning their reading, writing, and mathematics curricula to the English language arts (ELA) standards adopted in June 2012. Districts were previously contacted via email to ensure their 2023-2024 status is accurately reflected in this report. The survey results for 2022-2023 school year showed that of the 54 districts:

- 47 districts had all curricula aligned to Alaska State Education Performance Standards in reading, writing and math.
- Seven districts were currently in the process of aligning curricula to the Alaska State Education Performance Standards in the following areas:
 - Reading – Three
 - Writing – Six
 - Math – Three

The districts are aware that to make curricula alignment truly effective, it must occur not only at the district level, but at the school and classroom levels as well, involving teaching methods, student activities, and assessments.

In the 2023-2024 school year, many schools also reported using Quality Schools funds to continue their initiative to keep their curriculum aligned to state standards or reported that Quality Schools funded programs improved their students' performance on state assessments.

The seven schools identified in previous evaluations as having curricula that were not fully aligned with state standards have been contacted again in 2023-2024. The purpose of this outreach is to inquire about any updates or changes to their status, ensuring the most current information is on file.

Response to AS 14.03.078(5)

A description of the efforts by the department to assist a public school or district that receives a low performance designation under AS 14.03.123.

Identification of Schools and Districts

Due to an extended review on the change in cut scores, schools were not able to receive notice of designation exiting or entering the Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) until late spring of 2024. This resulted in a shortened planning window for those schools newly entering into designation. School year 2023-2024 was an off-cycle year for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) designations.

- No new schools were identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI (5%)) as the lowest performing five percent of schools receiving federal Title I fund. This CSI (5%) designation is in place for three years before a school is eligible to exit.
 - Twenty-three schools retained their CSI 5% designation from 2018 and 2019, and these schools will have the opportunity to exit in 2024/2025 provided they meet the exit criteria. These designations were held for two years due to a lack of comparative data from the Covid hold and the implementation of a new statewide assessment.
 - Nine schools retained their CSI 5% designation from 2022, and these schools will have the opportunity to exit in 2025/2026 provided they meet the exit criteria.
- Thirty-three retained their identification for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI (Grad Rate)) based upon a graduation rate not greater than two-thirds, or 66.67 percent. This designation is based upon the percent of graduating seniors. Starting in 2022/2023 this category moved to a three-year designation to provide stability in support. These schools will have the opportunity to exit in 2025/2026 provided they meet the exit criteria.
- Forty-eight schools were identified for Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) based upon a performance level of at least one of nine student groups within each school's general population at or below the 5% threshold established by CSI 5%. This is an annual designation with an opportunity to exit when criteria are met.
 - Twenty-eight schools were newly designated
 - Thirty-two schools exited out of ATSI designation
 - Twenty schools retained their ATSI designation
- Three schools were identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement – Targeted Support and Improvement (CSI-TSI), based upon a performance level of at least one of nine student groups within each school's general population at or below the 5% threshold established by CSI 5% for three (3) consecutive years.

DEED Support for Schools and Districts

The Alaska Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) uses both state general funds and federally sourced Title I, Part A funds to provide additional support for identified schools. Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) schools are required to develop and submit School Improvement Plans for approval to the department. These schools also have access to grant funds designated to assist in the implementation of school improvement plan activities, interventions, and are provided access to technical assistance and support. While beginning the implementation of a new planning process for our designated schools, Empowerment Specialists, seven contracted, and two DEED-staff trained in the Empowerment Process, were assigned to CSI 5% schools to provide support and technical.

School Improvement Plans: The Empowerment Process

The Empowerment Process was developed in partnership with the Region 16 Comprehensive Center, the Academic Development Institute (ADI), DEED, and reviewed/refined by five participating pilot schools during the 2021-2022

school year. Schools are supported in the process through DEED hosted workshops and webinars, DEED and ADI trained Empowerment Specialists, Alaska's Empowerment Playbook: A Hands on Guide to Successful School Improvement, as well as individual technical assistance as requested. DEED provides a school improvement plan template and links to resources and data analysis tools, available on the department's website.

The Empowerment Process takes schools through a thorough needs assessment, looking within the school at program usage and effectiveness, a profile review on student attendance and enrollment trends, achievement indicators, staff attendance and retention, maintenance, and safety reports, etc., and a practice review to look at the adult behaviors and expectations that contribute to the culture of the school. These are done in conjunction with a School and Community Leadership Team, and Four Key Learnings are then shared with the community to review and respond to and then used to build a three-year school improvement plan. The overarching goal of the process is to incorporate community needs and awareness into the plan, while also highlighting culture, already established assets, and addressing the root causes of perceived issues rather than treating the symptoms.

Technical Assistance and Support

School Improvement Grant Funds

Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) designated schools have access to funds designed to support the implementation of the locally developed School Improvement Plan. Eligible schools apply for these funds on an annual basis. The application, submitted through the department's Grants Management System (GMS), includes the submission of a needs assessment using the Empowerment Process, a three-year improvement plan, and a budget. Applications are submitted at the district level and must include all designated schools.

Empowerment Specialists

Empowerment Specialists are assigned schools designated as in need of support (CSI Lowest 5% and CSI-TSI). Empowerment Specialists provide a minimum of 40 hours a month of virtual support to the assigned schools. They support the Empowerment Process, working with schools and district liaisons on establishing community partnerships, data review, data analysis, determining root causes, plan alignment, goal setting, and the inclusion of evidence-based practices in their implementation plan. While most of their support comes from a distance/virtual, Empowerment Specialists are expected to do a site visit to each of their assigned schools (as resources and time allows) and support during the Fall and Spring convenings.

Statewide Professional Development Events

- The Alaska School Leadership Institute (ASLI) is an event provided each May in partnership with Alaska Staff Development Network (ASDN) and offers training for school and district leaders in effective English Language Arts and Math instruction and leadership capacity building. This event is targeted intentionally to rural schools and school districts.
- Alaska School Leadership Academy is a year-long cohort-based professional development experience sponsored by the Alaska Council of School Administrators and DEED.
- Response to Intervention/Multi-Tiered Systems of Support "Effective Instruction" Conference, sponsored by Anchorage School District and ASDN, is designed to help educators implement standards using a quality Response to Intervention system. CSI and TSI designated schools are provided with school improvement funds which they are encouraged to use to support staff attending this event.
- The Alaska Science of Reading Symposium is a three-day conference for Alaskan educators to connect understanding of reading science to classroom and leadership practices.
- Statewide CSI/ATSI Convenings (fall and spring) hosted by the department's School Recognition and Support Team.
- Biweekly webinar series on the Empowerment Process, best practices in school improvement, and technical

assistance on the submission and reviewing of plans, hosted by the department's School Recognition and Support Team.

Outside Partnerships Supporting School Improvement

- The Region 16 Comprehensive Center (R16CC), as the federally funded comprehensive resource center serving Alaska, is providing support in school-turnaround capacity at the department level in the areas of standards support, statewide literacy efforts, school improvement coach effectiveness, and updating the school improvement process.
- The Alaska Council of School Administrators (ACSA) provides support by working with school administrators and DEED staff to further a variety of state level initiatives. ACSA was a key partner in promoting Alaska's Education Challenge with districts and legislators.
- The Alaska Staff Development Network (ASDN) continues to support educators across Alaska. ASDN offers relevant webinars and other professional development opportunities that build a strong foundation for educators as they work to create sustainable systems within their districts and schools. ASDN also works in collaboration with DEED to support conferences throughout the year.
- The Southeast Regional Resource Center (SERRC) supports the department in providing grants for the hiring and training of Empowerment Specialists, who will work with CSI Lowest 5% schools on establishing leadership teams within the school and community, conducting a situational analysis, and building and implementing school improvement plans.
- The Regional Educational Laboratory that serves the Northwest (REL Northwest) is partnering with AK DEED to help schools in the Alaska Alternative Schools Coalition (AASC) field test trauma-engaged practices from the Transforming Schools Framework.

Response to AS 14.03.078(6)

A description of intervention efforts by each school district and school for students who are not meeting state performance standards.

In FY2024, the Alaska State Legislature provided Quality Schools funding to all 54 districts to assist them in their efforts to maximize student achievement through alignment to, implementation of, and the assessment of Alaska Education Standards. School districts must dedicate their funds to initiatives that fall under one of the four categories of standards: student standards and assessments, professional standards for teachers and administrators, family and community networks, and school excellence standards.

The Quality Schools Initiative has played an important role in assisting districts in aligning to state standards. A majority of districts now report their curricula are fully aligned to the Alaska English/Language Arts and Math State Performance Standards that were adopted in June 2012. Forty-seven school districts report complete alignment, six school districts indicate alignment to at least one of the three standards, and only two school districts report they are still in the process of aligning to all three standards. School districts not only align to the Alaska English/Language Arts and Math standards, but other standards such as science, history, arts, digital literacy, etc. As state standards evolve over the years, districts are required to review and align their curricula.

Implementing a variety of reading and math programs was the most common use of Quality Schools funds reported in 2023-2024. Twenty-two schools reported using funds to implement a new or existing reading program. Fourteen schools reported using funds to implement a new or existing math program. (Please note that state regulation indicates districts that receive less than \$10,000 do not need to submit an End of the Year Report. Thirteen districts received less than \$10,000.)

In addition to the emphasis on reading and math programs and their work on alignment to state standards, many districts also reported growth in reading and math as measured by state assessments, directly linking their use of Quality Schools funds to growth along state standards. Tutoring, assessment training, and professional development opportunities for teachers were common strategies implemented by school districts to increase student achievement in mathematics and reading.

Beyond the core reading and mathematics intervention strategies identified above, a variety of other academic supports were accomplished with Quality Schools funds during the 2023-2024 school year. Some other strategies utilized were curriculum material acquisition for reading or math programs (online platforms, reading vocabulary lists, etc.), community connectedness programs and events, and remedial and enrichment programs. Less frequently reported were after-school and summer programs.

Importantly, in 2023-2024 most districts utilized Quality Schools funds to continue a program or initiative that began in previous years, indicating the success of those programs and that Quality Schools funds are instrumental in their continued implementation.
